"2023 saw Young Enterprise proudly celebrate 60 years of transforming young people's lives through enterprise and financial education. Since 1963, we've worked with over 7 million young people, 1.1 million of whom have set up and run 84,000 student companies.

During the 2022-23 academic year, we were delighted to have over 9,500 young people create and run nearly 900 Young Enterprise Companies across the UK. Reflecting on our achievements over the last six decades provides a fantastic springboard towards what's next. A real-life learning opportunity that empowers young people aged 13-19 to set up and run their own student company.

With guidance from a volunteer* and access to extensive resources and step-by-step guides via our brand-new, dedicated platform, Company Connect, the student teams make all the decisions about their business, from choosing their company name, managing the company finances and selling to the public.

Over the course of the programme, young people are introduced to the realities of the world of work and gain practical business experience, develop an enterprising mindset and build employability skills.

"For us, the Company Programme is the gold standard in enterprise education and that's why we've been taking part for 20+ years. We see a tremendous impact on our students. The programme opens their eyes to being ambitious, creative and designing quality systems for getting things done. As a rural school, the programme has made 'bigger and better' a real option for those taking part."



Sea Clearly, a Year 12 team from Cockermouth School in Cumbria, set out to create a product that didn't just appeal to customers but also helped the environment.

Together, the group of 16 students collected sea glass from local beaches and used it to create a range of unique necklaces and earrings. To further their positive impact, the team also responsibly collected and disposed of litter found on the beach.

When asked about key learnings, Sea Clearly cited balancing the social element of working in a team with discipline as being essential for action:

"We've learnt that business is really important, and you've got to balance the friendly social side with action and discipline. You've got to be honest, you've got to be open with all of your workers and it's really important to be inclusive of everyone. Making sure everyone is treated as equals."

Sea Clearly achieved Runner-Up at the Cumbria/ Lancashire Company of The Year Final and were awarded the Sustainability Award at the subsequent Northwest competition round.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS

September 2023 saw the launch of our brand new, dedicated platform, Company Connect. With a student-centric design, Company Connect provides an engaging and easy-to-navigate online experience, that enables young people to take control of their learning.

Broken down into simple tasks, with points and badges available to celebrate achievements throughout, young people are encouraged to work collaboratively and maximise their learning. The exciting addition of Company Connect diary entries reminds students to reflect on their experience whilst also providing new insight into the ups and downs of running a business.

Further developments for 2023-24 have centred around improving the consistency of student experience across the UK. The introduction of a portfolio of events, including three subject-focused workshops on ideation, finance and marketing as well as two 'Pitch To The Panel' opportunities where students can gain feedback on their ideas and presentations, has ensured that all young people have access to equal learning opportunities.

Looking forward, our new Opportunities Hub provides a route for students to continue their learning and gain new skills and experiences. Embedded as a core task within Milestone 8, all young people who've participated in Company Programme are invited to register and take advantage of continued opportunities to learn and develop post-programme.
