

Young Money (formerly pfeg) - My Money Week National Competition for Schools

Rules, terms and conditions

1. This competition is organised and administered by Young Money (Part of Young Enterprise), Yeoman House, Sekforde Street, London EC1R 0HF. Young Enterprise is limited by guarantee no. 712260, registered charity no. 313697. You can contact us via: info@pfeg.org
2. In these terms and conditions “**YE**”, “**We**”, “**Us**” or “**Our**” means Young Enterprise (registered company number 712660; registered charity number 313697) and “**You**”, “**Your**”, or the “**Organisation**” means the primary school, secondary school or other educational establishment that participates in **My Money Week National Competition 2019** (also referred to as the “**National Competition**”). “**Entrant**” means any child who partakes in the National Competition.
3. The National Competition is open to residents of the United Kingdom who are aged between 4 and 19 and in full time education, only. Entries from outside the UK will not be considered.
4. Entry to the National Competition is free of charge and no purchase is necessary.
5. Entrant must be no older than 19 years old on or by 31st July 2019. YE may require Entrant to provide proof that they are eligible to enter the National Competition.
6. Adult (that is, a parent or guardian of the entrant) permission is required for the entrant to agree to the terms and enter the National Competition.
7. You shall ensure that the parent and /or guardian of each Entrant has provided express consent for the Entrant to enter into the National Competition and for the Entrant personal information to be provided and used by YE in accordance with the YE [Privacy Policy](#) and You shall ensure that a record of such consents are maintained by You during the National Competition and for a reasonable period of time thereafter. YE reserves the right to audit such records at any time upon reasonable notice and, if required by YE, You shall be obliged to provide copies of any and all consent forms reasonably required by YE within 48 hours of any such request.
8. We will not be responsible for any claims made by Entrant and/or their parents or guardians that allege any entries were effected and/or personal data (including, but not limited to work or photographs) were uploaded without the appropriate consents
9. The National Competition is not open to employees (or members of their immediate families) of YE or its holding or subsidiary companies or employees of agents or suppliers of YE or its holding or subsidiary companies, who are professionally connected with the National Competition or its administration.
10. To enter the National Competition, Entrants will need to provide YE with their name, age, school/educational establishment name and submit their competition entry through a teacher/trainer/facilitator at a school or other educational establishment whom must provide YE with their own name, address, telephone number and email address. YE will only use Entrants' personal details for the purposes of administering the National Competition
11. Only one entry will be accepted per Entrant.
12. Entries must be 2D and no larger than an A4 page. Entries can be either landscape or portrait, either handwritten/ hand drawn, or a printed hard copy created on a computer. Entries can be in black or white or in colour. Entries should address the specific theme of the category being entered. Entry format is not restricted and can take the form of a story, poem, article or illustration depending on the competition requirements for the particular category. In order to qualify for judging, all entries must include a completed copy of the teacher/trainer/facilitator entry form and the entry form for children aged 4-7 or 7-11 or young people aged 12-19 years. Each and every page of an entry must contain the full Entrant name, age and school/educational establishment name, written clearly at the top.
13. Entrants will be eligible to submit their entry to one of three categories depending on their age at the time of entry, either: (a) Primary Category 1 (primarily aimed at children aged 4-7); (b)

Primary Category 2 (primarily aimed at children aged 7 – 11) or (c) Secondary Category (primarily aimed at children aged 12-19).

14. The National Competition will commence at 08.00 on Monday 29th April 2019 and close at 11:59pm on Friday 19th July 2019. All valid entries received before the closing date will be considered by the judges. 10 Entries from each of the three categories will be shortlisted from all Entries by Our My Money Week Coordinator in accordance with and subject to the criteria set out in the Competition Entry Criteria Document. The final shortlisted Entries will be judged by an external panel including an independent judge. The judges will assess innovation, flair, creativity and enthusiasm when judging Entries. The judges' decision is final. No correspondence between judges and Organisations, or Entrants will be entered into.
15. Successful Entrants will be notified by Friday 13th September 2019.
16. The address provided on the teacher/trainer/facilitator entry form will be used to send any prizes, and the telephone number and email address will be used to notify winners. Please make sure these are correct.
17. No responsibility can be accepted for any entries lost, delayed or mislaid for any reason whatsoever. Proof of sending is not proof of receipt.
18. All expenses incurred as part of entering the National Competition, unless specifically stated otherwise, are the sole responsibility of the Entrant.
19. The judges' decision regarding winners is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
20. All National Competition entries and any accompanying material submitted to YE will become the property of YE on receipt and will not be returned. If Entrants would like to keep the original artwork, they are asked to submit a copy as their entry.
21. By submitting a National Competition entry and any accompanying material, Entrants agree to:
 - a. assign to YE all intellectual property rights in the entry with full title guarantee; and
 - b. surrender all moral rights (including the right to be identified as author of the entry and the right to control modifications to and destruction of the entry, in and to the Entrants' National Competition entry and otherwise arising in connection with the entry to which the entrant may now or at any time in the future be entitled under the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988 as amended from time to time and under all similar legislation from time to time in force anywhere in the world.
22. You and each Entrant warrant and agree that:
 - a. so far as You are aware the Entrants are (and will be) the sole creators and authors of the entry;
 - b. the Entrants have the right to make the Entry to for all purposes of the National Competition;
 - c. the entry will not infringe upon, misappropriate or otherwise violate any third party intellectual property right or proprietary right including, without limitation, any registered or unregistered trademark, copyright, design rights or patent, nor any privacy rights, moral rights nor any other rights of any person or entity;
 - d. the entry does not contain any content which violates or infringes upon the rights of others, which is unlawful, threatening, abusive, defamatory, invasive of privacy or publicity rights, vulgar, obscene, profane, indecent or otherwise objectionable, which encourages conduct or is conduct that would constitute a criminal offence, gives rise to civil liability or otherwise violates any applicable law.
23. By entering the National Competition, Entrant agree that any personal information provided with the National Competition entry may be held and used only by YE or its agents and suppliers to administer the National Competition.
24. Subject to YE's Privacy Policy (available [here](#)), Entrant may be required to take part in promotional activity and YE reserves the right to use the names, schools and towns of winners, their photographs and audio and/or visual recordings of them in any publicity related to the National Competition and may be invited to take part in television or other media campaigns.

25. Prizes

- i. The overall winners in each Category (Primary Category 1, Primary Category 2 and Secondary Category) will receive a £50 All 4 One gift card (<https://www.one4allgiftcard.co.uk/>) and £500 for their school/ educational establishment.
- ii. The three runners-up in each Category (Primary Category 1, Primary Category 2 and Secondary Category) will receive a £25 All 4 One gift card (<https://www.one4allgiftcard.co.uk/>) and £250 for their school/educational establishment.
- iii. Each winner and runner up, along with their nominated parent or guardian plus one teacher from the associated organisation, will be invited to attend a prize giving event in October (exact date TBC) at a central London location. YE will cover the transport costs to and from London (up to £150 per winner or runner up) upon receipt of valid evidence of travel expenses.

26. Prizes are not negotiable and cannot be transferred

27. Prizes for schools/educational establishments will not be awarded or transferable to individuals.

28. No part of the non-cash prizes is exchangeable for cash or any other prize.

29. If an advertised prize is not available, we reserve the right to offer an alternative prize of equal or greater value.

30. Insofar as is permitted by law, YE, its agents or distributors will not in any circumstances be responsible or liable to compensate the winner or accept any liability for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a result of taking up the prize except where it is caused by the negligence of YE, its agents or distributors or that of their employees. The Entrant's legal rights are not affected.

31. By entering the National Competition, You and the Entrants agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless YE and its respective affiliated companies and all of its respective past and present officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives from and against any and all claims, expenses, and liabilities (including legal fees), including but not limited to negligence and damages of any kind to persons and property, defamation, infringement of trademark, copyright, design right or other intellectual property rights, property damage, or death or personal injury arising out of or relating to Your entry or participation in the National Competition.

32. You shall be responsible for the health and safety of all Entrants and compliance with all relevant legal requirements.

33. YE reserves the right to amend, suspend or cancel this competition where it becomes necessary to do so or due to circumstances beyond its control.

36. These terms are governed by English law and Entrant can bring legal proceedings in respect of the services in the English courts. If the entrant lives in Scotland they can bring legal proceedings in respect of the products in either the Scottish or the English courts. If the entrant lives in Northern Ireland they can bring legal proceedings in respect of the National Competition in either the Northern Irish or the English courts.
